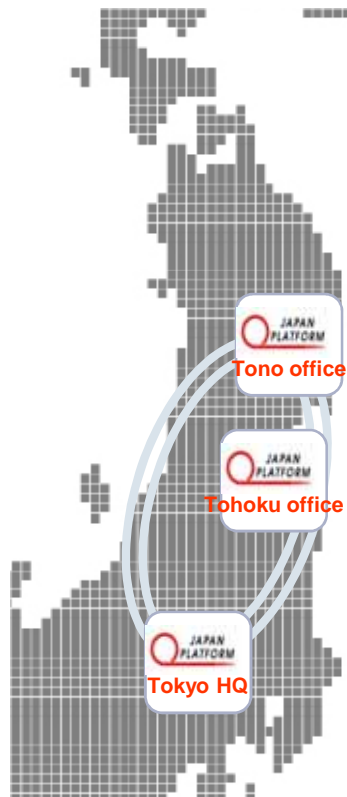

JPF has tackled the following undertakings since March 11th :



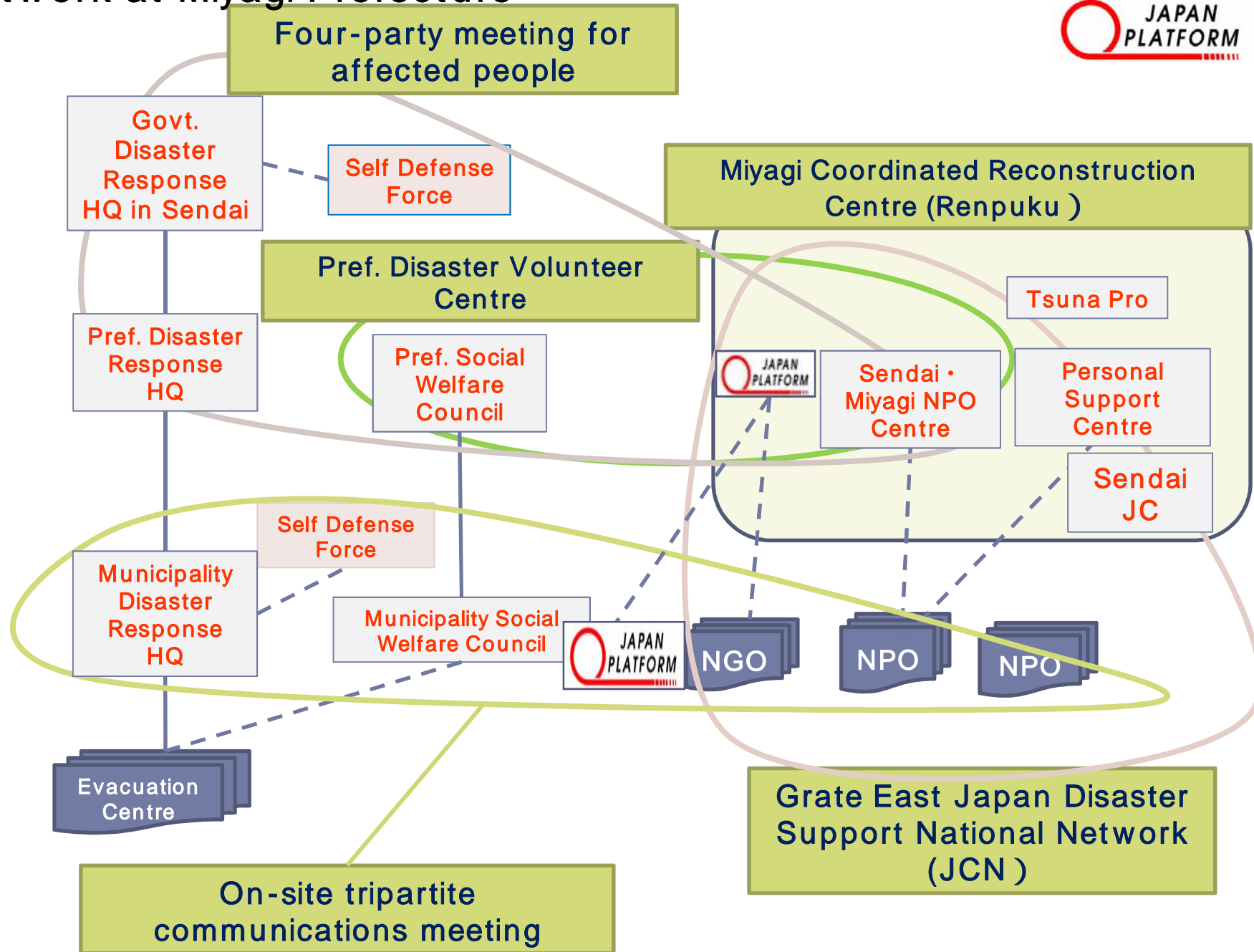
JPF began providing grant funding to member NGOs, matching aid supplies and service providers with on-the-spot needs, conducting coordination per sector, and carrying out coordination of aid activities in the municipalities.

JPF established a Tohoku office in Sendai, Miyagi this April. The office has been instrumental in implementing aid activities efficiently and effectively in coordination with local Social Welfare Councils, Disaster Response HQ, local administration, local NPOs, and local network groups.

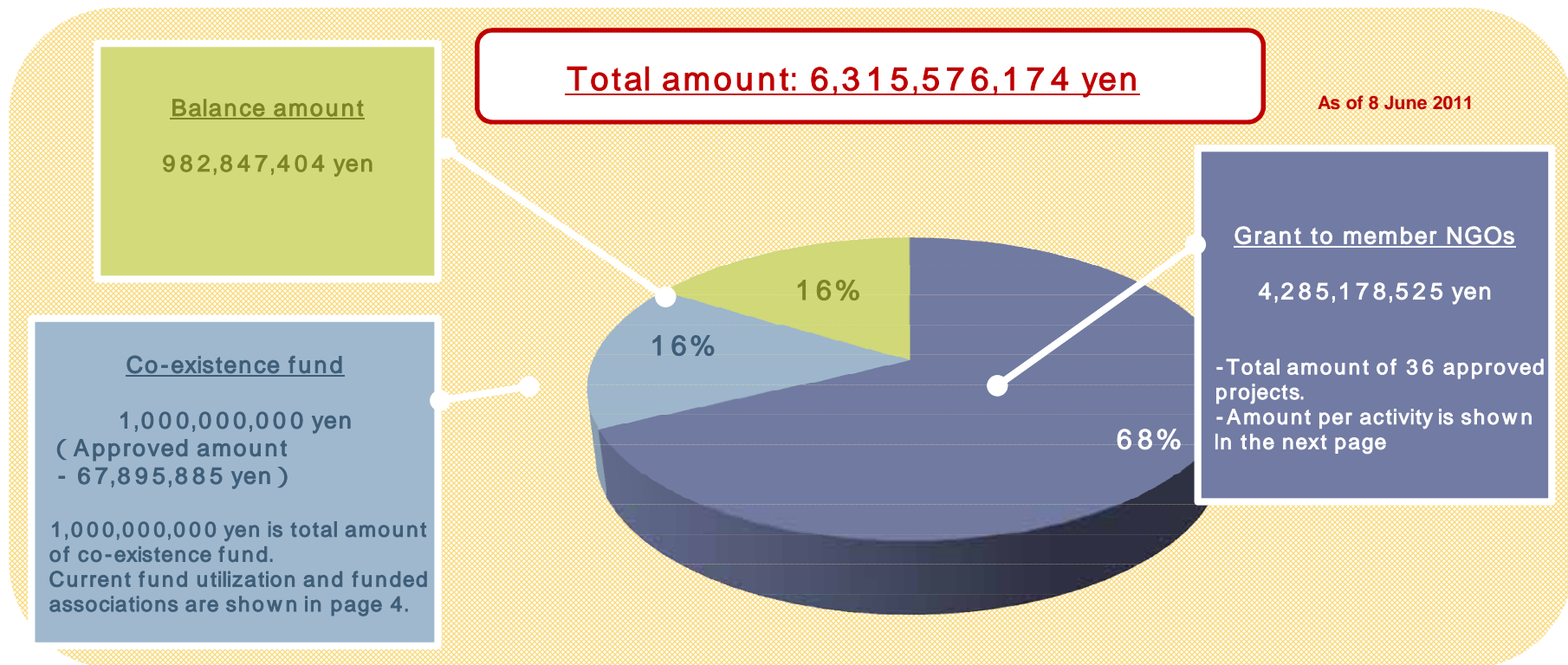
JPF also set up an office in Tono, Iwate, and plans to open another one in Fukushima so that they may proceed in further covering a wide range of affected areas.

Furthermore, JPF started a `co-existence` fund to supply aid activities implemented by non-NGO unit members, i.e., local NPOs and local corporate businesses.

Immediately after the disaster, over 37,000 donations have been provided by individuals, corporations and associations.
So far, about 4.3 billion yen was allocated to NGOs to support disaster affected people. Although not mentioned here, as well as money, many aid supplies and services have been provided. Therefore, JPF has been tackling with matching with on-the-spot needs.

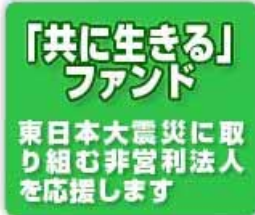

In order to support the people affected by the Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami with a view to enhancing their “ self-reliance ”, “ harmonious coexistence ” and “ spirit ”, JPF started a “ co-existence ” fund to resource aid activities implemented by nonprofit organizations with JPF grant funding. The first and second rounds of applications have been accepted and approved.

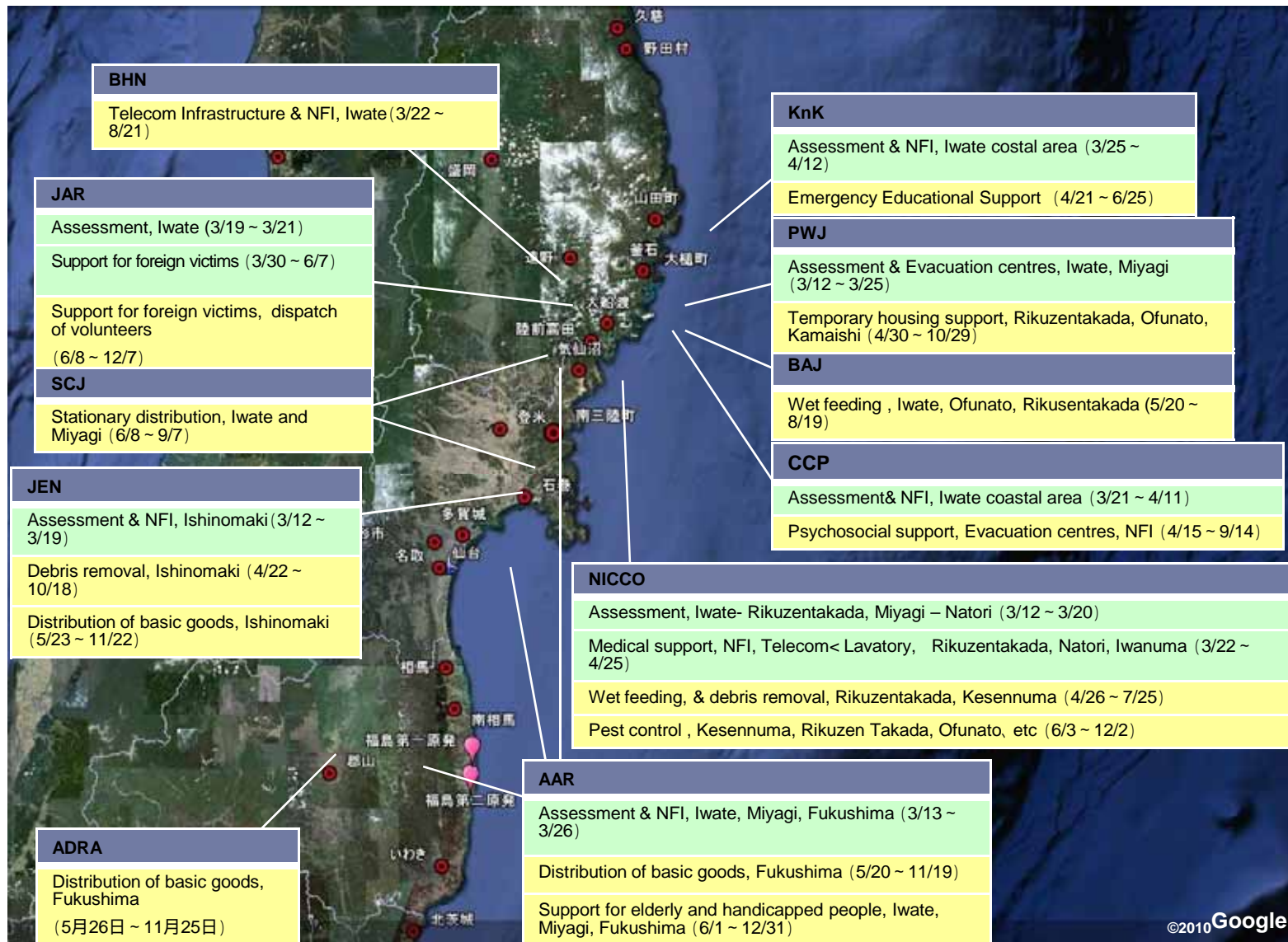
