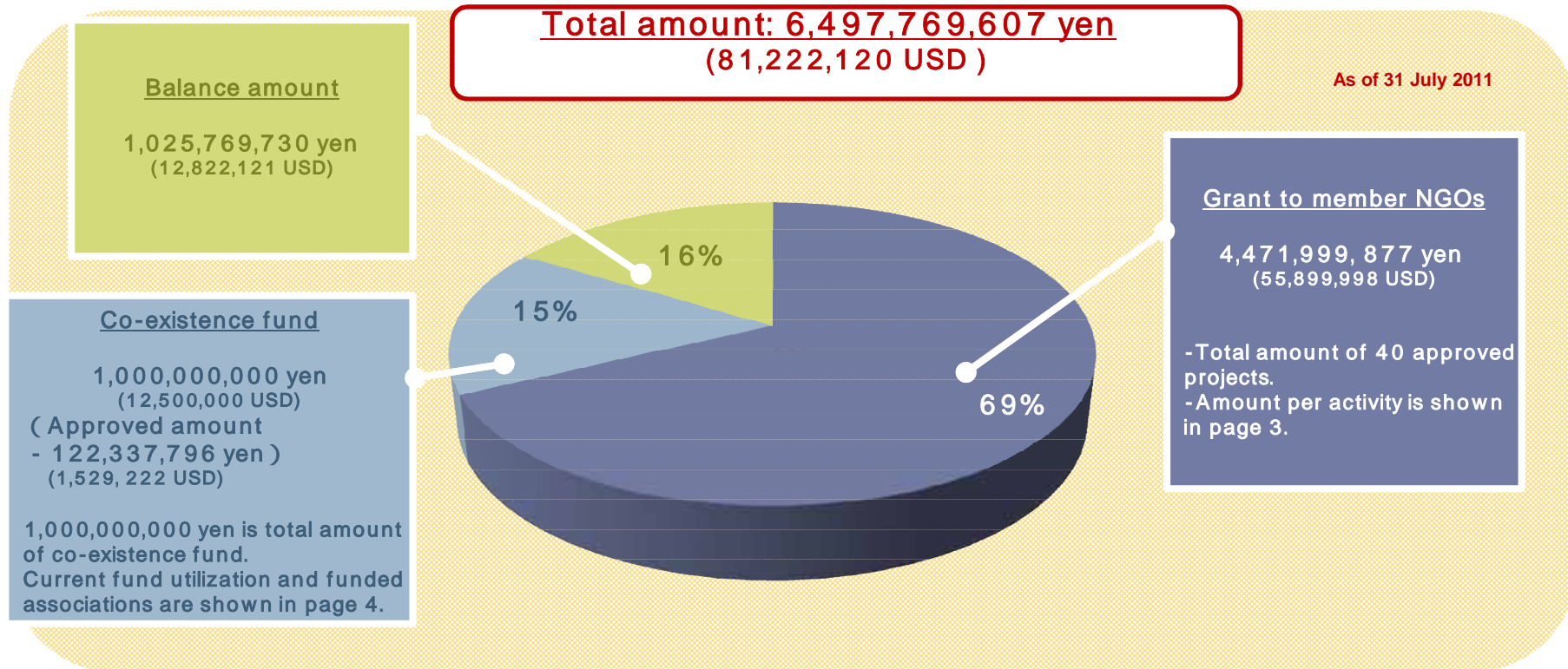

Public Reporting Forum on Emergency Assistance Activities

On 21st July 2011, there was a public reporting forum on JPF's emergency assistance on the Great East Japan Earthquake.

In addition to the report from JPF staff, there were reports from two NGOs (ADRA Japan and NICCO), and a panel discussion.

Evaluating the Emergency Assistance Activities in the Initial Response Period

In order to improve our assistance activities, we asked specialists to carry out monitoring and evaluation of the activities in the initial response period (11th March to 11th June).

Aim: Through evaluation of the projects by JPF in the initial response period, we aim to 1) draw out lessons for coping with future disasters in Japan and 2) make a proposal in the role JPF can play in the recovery period of Great East Japan Earthquake,

Perspective: 1) Assistance in evacuation center, 2) Assistance for people moving out from evacuation center, 3) Coordination and logistic support, 4) Assistance for vulnerable people / considerations in regionality.

Conclusion:

Proposals for the recovery period: 1) Detailed assistance for people moving out from evacuation center , 2) Recovery of medical / working / learning / playing environment, 3) Making effective use of 'Co-existence Fund', 4) Enhancing the ability in collecting and transmitting information, 5) Continuous support for vulnerable people.

Lessons for coping with future disasters: 1) Designing the strategy for future disasters in Japan, 2) Enhancing the coordinating function with the support group and governments from abroad, and with the Japanese NGOs, 3) Enhancing the assistance for vulnerable people.

We will give full report of this evaluation at a later date.

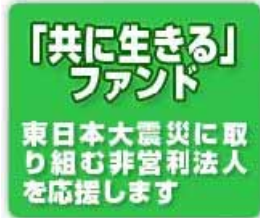

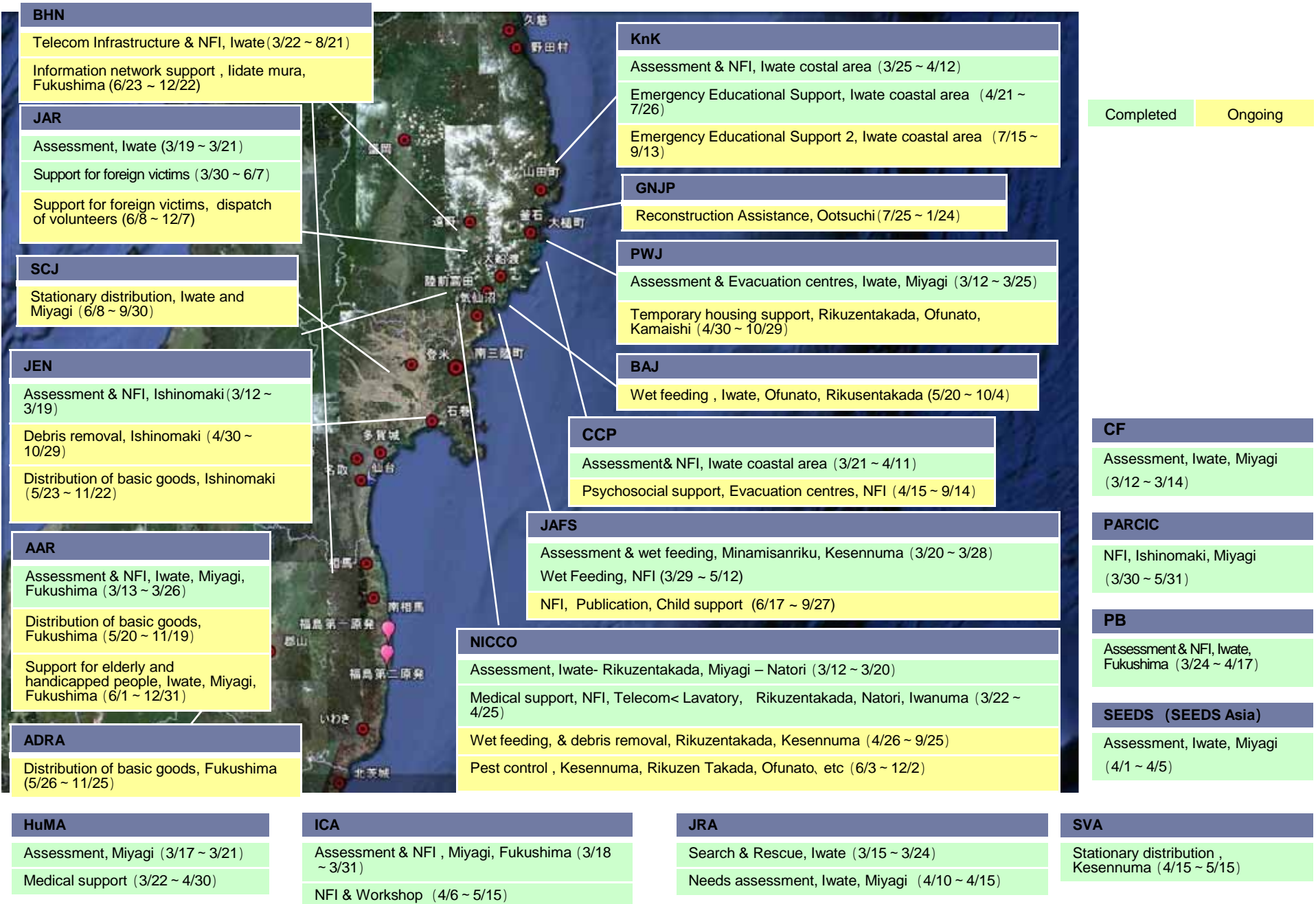
