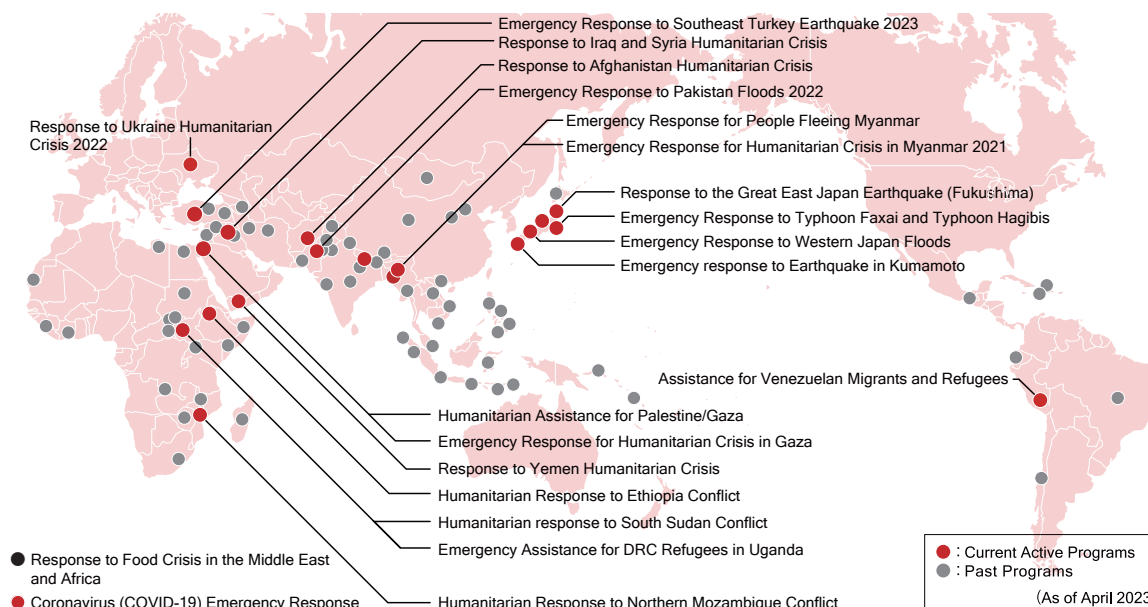

To this end, NGOs, the government of Japan, business communities, and intellectuals come together in partnership, and aid activities are implemented under coordination and cooperation that make the most of each party's characteristics and resources.	
Accomplishments	Since our foundation in 2000, JPF has delivered humanitarian aid to 60 countries and regions, over 1,900 programs totaling 76 billion yen.
